# **Upcoming Events**

Holy Week at St Peter's is an emotional time of reflection, worship, and celebration. Our traditions were upended last year as we dealt with forced isolation and quarantine, and we are eager to gather together as a congregation again for this special series of services. While conditions continue to improve, we are still challenged with uncertainty and the desire to keep our community as safe as possible. Our Church Council has approved the Worship and Music Committee's proposal to hold a hybrid of in-person and online worship out of respect for those who are unable to attend, and in joyous welcome for those who are ready to reenter the sanctuary. Our hope is that worship will be fulfilling and nurturing to all who participate, either from home or in person. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday worship will be livestreamed at 7pm. We are also inviting people to join us in person for these 2 services. Easter Sunday worship will begin at 10am, and will be both livestreamed and include people in the sanctuary. All 3 in-person options (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday) will be 40 minutes long with limited singing, and will have a maximum of 40 people in the sanctuary (this includes Pastor, Ben, Jen, and the Lector). After Easter Sunday, we will return to livestream only for a few weeks - Council wants to assess how things went, and allow for additional vaccinations, etc., to happen. Our hope is to decide at our April Council meeting to re-open for good on May 2<sup>nd</sup>, as we celebrate our church's 154<sup>th</sup> birthday. Following COVID safety protocols for distance, temperature-taking, sanitizing, cleaning, and masking, we will be limiting attendance to under 40 per service, and will take online reservations for those who plan to come in person.
