together in the Spirit (although perhaps apart in space and time) when the Pastor prompts us. Please not this week we have a responsive Prayer of Consecration.

Please remember, our Office Manager Laura Olson is on vacation right now! She is not returning until Tuesday, July 13th. Sharon Johnson has graciously offered to be in the Office during Laura's 9 – 2 hours this Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Pastor Richard will be in during Laura's hours Thursday and Friday. Thank you, Sharon!

If you are receiving emails from the Church Office on a weekly basis, such as "This Week at St. Peter's," and have missed what are new protocols are, check the "This Week" email from Monday, June 21st and / or the new July Announcer newsletter. Right now we are distancing every-other-pew (instead of one out of every three) and if you are fully vaccinated, you are free not to wear a mask -- but you are free to wear one if that is your choice!

This month of July has 5 Saturdays -- that means it is our turn to partner with the staff at the Community Kitchen of A Just

Harvest for our 'turn to serve' on Saturday, July 31st. Each time since COVID restrictions came into place, we have not been cooking the sloppy joes and bringing them in, and then purchasing the rest of the meal we are responsible for, but have ask for financial commitments before hand which accumulate to \$500 for their curbside service. We are hopeful of returning to the old m.o. this autumn. There will soon be a link for us as individuals to make a financial commitment for the dinner costs, with which the Kitchen staff will buy, cook the meal, and deliver to the customers.

The Board of Elders hold a Zoom / phone meeting next Thursday at 4 PM.

There was an initial meeting of the Strategic Planning Committee last Wednesday, via Zoom, from 7:00 to 8:30 PM. A second one is Thursday, July 8, same time.

SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

July 4, 2021 Mark 6:1-13

Sent with Power Independence Day

In a few weeks, from July 11-18, a General Synod like no other will convene via teleconferencing.

The General Synod of the United Church of Christ is the national decision-making body for the denomination, responsible for giving general direction to the evangelistic, missionary, and justice programs of the UCC. Rather than making proclamations to the church, which the church must obey, General Synod is in a real sense a gathering of the church at large. General Synod speaks to but not for the church, and as we gather together as one, it reminds us of our radical interconnectedness.

Since the beginnings of this youthful denomination more than sixty years ago, regular meetings of General Synod have given direction and purpose to the church as a whole, as well as providing an opportunity for thousands of delegates to learn, participate in service and mission projects, attend inspiring worship, and meet up with friends old and new.

The theme of this year's General Synod is "Rooted In Love," and the logo shows a tree planted by a river to reflect the words of Psalm 1:3a, "they are like trees planted by streams of water." The logo is a poignant reminder of being rooted in Christ's love, and the water that flows like a connection between our churches and other settings of the UCC. Although our gathering will be online instead of in-person this year, the elements that make General Synod so special and uplifting will remain.

On this Independence Day, we remember and rejoice in our fundamental INTERDEPENDENCE as we prepare and plan for General Synod 2021. Visitors are welcome at General Synod. Search for General Synod 33 on ucc.org to register. If you cannot attend all or part of General Synod this year, keep the church as it gathers in your prayers.



SCRIPTURES FOR THE CONGREGATION July 4, 2021

2 Samuel 5:1-5, 9-10

Then all the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron, and said, "Look, we are your bone and flesh. For some time, while Saul was king over us, it was you who led out Israel and brought it in. The LORD said to you: It is you who shall be shepherd of my people Israel, you who shall be ruler over Israel." So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron; and King David made a covenant with them at Hebron before the LORD, and they anointed David king over Israel. David was thirty years old when he began to reign, and he reigned forty years.

At Hebron he reigned over Judah seven years and six months; and at Jerusalem he reigned over all Israel and Judah thirty-three years.

David occupied the stronghold, and named it the city of David. David built the city all around from the Millo inward. And David became greater and greater, for the LORD, the God of hosts, was with him.

2 Corinthians 12:2-10

I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows.

And I know that such a person—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows — was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses.

But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me.

Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.

Jesus has been discussing things, and disputing things, with some of his fellow Jews.

John 8:31-38

Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." They answered him, "We are descendants of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by saying, 'You will be made free'?"

Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. The slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there forever. So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed.

I know that you are descendants of Abraham; yet you look for an opportunity to kill me, because there is no place in you for my word. I declare what I have seen in the Father's presence; as for you, you should do what you have heard from the Father."
